However, the impacts of these provisions will be principally felt by children and young people, and perhaps even disproportionally so more of the more vulnerable cohorts such as children with special education needs and disabilities. Where there are differential impacts, we believe the public health reasons justify the approach, and there is no alternative way of dealing with the public health risks as urgently and effectively.'

The LSP EIA is required to consider whether any of the measures within our risk assessments, beyond those determined by the Government, have any adverse impacts on groups or individuals with protected characteristics (Race, Religion or Belief, Disability, Sex, Gender Reassignment, Sexual Orientation, Age, Marriage or Civil Partnership, Pregnancy or Maternity).
